PSP is a tauopathy that often presents with atypical parkinsonism with vertical gaze palsy and early unexplained falls, but other clinical presentations are increasingly recognized (Williams and Lees 2009; Dickson et al. 2010). Pathologically, PSP is characterized by abnormal tau within neurons and glia (Fig. 4 A-D).
