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Focused Observations How To Observe

Controlled observation tends to take place in a laboratory environment. It is focused on revealing quantitative data though it may also yield qualitative observations. To carry out a controlled observation it's best to formulate a series of observations and have the observer carry these out at each step in the process.

The OODA loop (Observe, Orient, Decide, Act) is a four-step approach to decision-making that focuses on filtering available information, putting it in context and quickly making the most appropriate decision while also understanding that changes can be made as more data becomes available. The strategy is applicable at an individual level as well as an organizational level.

All observations and uses of observational evidence are theory laden in this sense (cf. Chang 2005, Azzouni 2004). Observations were scheduled at the teachers' discretion and lasted for an entire morning. During each visit, observers watched each of the participating children in turn, in a series of alternating 15-minute cycles or occasions (10-minute observation, 5-minute coding), for an average of 16 observations (four per child).

Observations of Children's Interactions with Teachers ...

Observe client/family during assessment process (clinical observations). Engagement Methods: Refer to assessment results and symptoms; solicit agreement. Identify how treatment progress will be determined (e.g., scores will go down, routines will be restored).

Observing and assessing children's learning and development

Traditionally, lesson observation and teacher feedback have been focused on performance evaluation. The observer (usually the headmaster / principal) schedules the observation ahead of time, sits at the back of the room (often making the teacher anxious), and records subjective observations using unvalidated observation protocols.
